
Dr. Clifford Katz will show you how to avoid burnout by "Becoming a Hardy Dentist: Moving from Stress to Success."

The potential for stress is present everywhere in our personal and professional lives. We have also become increasingly aware of the negative physical and emotional consequences of stress overload. Managing a dental practice today can place seemingly relentless demands upon the time and energy of the dentist, leading some to feel that they are victims of overwhelming life stress. The end result can be serious career burnout.

However, theory and research in the field of stress are now shedding new light on the role that each of us plays both in perceiving our own stress and in managing it effectively. Psychologists have identified a personality trait, hardiness, which characterized dentists who seem to be unusually successful at managing their stress levels and maintaining their enthusiasm for the profession.

This presentation will focus on the causes and consequences of stress in the lives of today's dentist. In addition, we will address the

characteristics of the hardy dentist and explore ways in which each of us can develop more effective methods for dealing with stress and achieving balance in our lives - in other words, how to become more hardy.

NODA MEMBER PROVIDES DENTISTRY IN THE HOME

Dr. Joseph Shedlarski has been conducting a practice in geriatric dental care.

Through his home dental services, he has treated patients in private homes, hospital rooms, as well as nursing home settings.

Advances in both dental materials and portable equipment have made the delivery of dental health care possible in such alternative settings.

The development of glass ionomers, photopolymerizing resins, and the advent of batteryoperated handpieces have contributed to treatment that can make the homebound patient comfortable.

Such services can be an adjunct to a private practice but require ingenuity and logistical planning to make them work.

Dr. Shedlarski conducts his services on a referral basis from dental clinicians, physicians, and patients of record. His service has been endorsed by the Elder Advantage Program at East Jefferson Hospital.

MEMBER RETURNS FROM MILITARY

Dr. Robert Shaye, a NODA member called to active service during Operation Desert Storm, is back in civilian life after more than four months on active duty.

Dr. Shaye, a U.S. Army colonel, was stationed at Fort Polk where the dental department conducted, among other duties, 10,000 to 12,000 dental examinations.

"At Fort Polk my main function was to do demobilization dental examinations," said Dr. Shaye, who has returned to his post as director of research at LSUSD.

"Probably 10,000 to 12,000 service personnel were mobilized through Fort Polk. The bulk of these were Louisiana National Guardsmen."

Dr. Shaye was the senior ranking dentist among 35 practitioners at Fort Polk. They also performed dental care for soldiers requesting it and took care of those already stationed at Fort Polk and their dependents.
