
Dr. Avishai Sadan to speak

Conference engages 'hot' clinician; Dr. Dickerson is much sought after

Dr. William Dickerson, perhaps the "hottest" clinician on the conference circuit, has been signed to conduct the all-day pre-conference course at the 1998 New Orleans Dental Conference.

Title of his course is an intriguing one. It's "Futuramic Dentistry," no doubt looking forward to the 21st millennium.

Dr. Dickerson lectures internationally on esthetic dentistry. Considered by many to be the most influential dentist in America, he is the most sought after speaker, lecturing over 130 days a year.

He is visiting clinical professor of the Comprehensive Esthetic Restorative Continuum at Baylor College of Dentistry as well as director of the Las Vegas Institute of Cosmetic Dentistry, where dentists from all over the world come to learn his techniques.

Dr. Dickerson is editor-in-chief of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry Journal. He is a Fellow of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry (one of only 21 in the world).

Scientific Affairs Council challenges CRA-tested waterline protocols

(Council on Scientific Affairs' Response to CRA Tested Waterline Protocols) Adopted by the Council on Scientific Affairs, September 24, 1997

The September 1997 issue of CRA Newsletter presents a variety of protocols for controlling waterline contamination in dental units with independent water systems. The Council on Scientific Affairs has serious reservations about the suggested protocols with regard to patient and staff safety, efficacy and dental equipment compatibility.

The Council on Scientific Affairs believes that the methodology used by CRA overlooks key factors in evaluating antimicrobial agents for their ability to control dental unit water quality. Specifically, CRA fails to recognize that the safety and efficacy of any particular chemical will be highly dependent on:

- The extent to which the waterlines are colonized, i.e., whether or not there is an established biofilm;
- The concentration and type of the antimicrobial agent used;
- The extent to which the chemical may be inactivated by the organic material in the biofilm;
- The disinfection protocol used, e.g., daily or periodic use;
- The extent to which the chemical can be removed from the system by flushing before the unit is used again for patient treatment;
- Whether or not air purging regimens are used to supplement the disinfection protocol, e.g., waterlines may be air-purged and left dry overnight to discourage microbial growth;
- The type of of dental unit in which the chemical agent is used, e.g., household bleach may be compatible with some dental units but not others.

As the safety and efficacy of chemical disinfection protocols outlined in the CRA Newsletter have not been sufficiently validated, the Council strongly discourages dentists from treating their dental unit waterlines in the manners suggested by CRA. In particular, the Council warns against the use of glutaraldehyde in treatment-water delivery systems to meet the goals set out in the ADA's Statement on Dental Unit Waterlines.

Glutaraldehyde is a recognized health haz-

ard; it is a known dermal, mucosal, respiratory and systemic irritant that, as stated on its labeling, is only intended for use in closed containers.

In addition to the potentially serious adverse health effects that may be associated with glutaraldehyde when used in dental unit waterlines, such use will essentially fix or "glue" the biofilm matrix to the surface of the waterline, leaving an ideal environment for microbial re-colonization.

The Council on Scientific Affairs is of the opinion that the studies undertaken by CRA do not allow any conclusions to be drawn as to the safety and efficacy of chemical agents used for disinfecting dental unit waterlines.

The ADA, the dental industry and other researchers are devoting many resources to address the issue of dental unit waterline contamination. Research to date has revealed promising methodologies that may allow dentists to control or prevent biofilm formation in dental unit waterlines. At the present time, however, there are insufficient data to justify any definitive recommendation(s).

In the meantime, dentists wishing to implement any waterline disinfection protocol should do so only after consultation with their dental unit manufacturer.



Radiology prof has taught 'em all

Dr. A. Peter "Pete" Fortier, professor emeritus at LSUSD, has probably taught more dentists and dental hygienists than anyone in Louisiana.

Although he retired in 1991 after 22 years of teaching radiology at LSU Dental School – he continues as a volunteer teacher – Dr. Fortier is active in the private practice of radiology at his offices in Metairie.

There he accepts referrals from dentists and physicians in the areas of head and neck, including oral and maxillofacial radiology and photography. He offers a wide range of radiographs, including orthodontic records.

Pete Fortier has had an unusual and interesting career. The ink was barely dry on his diploma from Warren Easton High School when World War II came along and with it 42 months in the Army Air Corps, including service in the South Pacific.

Upon discharge, he attended Loyola U. and received a BS degree in physics. After graduation, he joined Westinghouse as an X-ray engineer.

"But even from high school days the thought of becoming a dentist was on my mind," he recalled. In 1954, even though he and his wife Betty now had two children, he took the plunge.

Loyola's dental school class was filled. Rather than wait another year, Pete entered the University of Tennessee School of Dentistry where he graduated in 1959.

Then it was back to New Orleans where he practiced general dentistry, soon joining the faculty at Loyola to teach periodontology and oral diagnosis. When Dr. Ed Jeansonne, dean at Loyola, formed the LSU School of Dentistry, Dr. Fortier was one of the professors he

brought over to LSUSD.

Counting service at the two schools, Dr. Fortier has taught dental students for 34 years and he doesn't regret a day of it.

"Along the way people have told me I could make more money in private practice," says Dr. Fortier. "I always tell them that it's more fun teaching."

"I like to help the students. I'll bend over backwards to help a student," he adds.

Many honors have come to the veteran educator, who retains the slim, wiry physique of a halfback.

A Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology, he is a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, a member of the Pierre Fauchard International Honor Society, and Omicron Kappa Upsilon Honor Society, as well as NODA, LDA and ADA, among others.

Holder of a master's in education from UNO, in addition to his DDS and BS in physics, he is licensed to practice in both Louisiana and Mississippi. He has served on numerous committees at LSUSD and is a former coordinator of learning resources.

A strong supporter of the teachings of Dr. C. Edmund Kells, he advises all his students to read Kell's textbooks.

He has presented papers to the ADA as well as dental groups in London and Utrecht. He currently has an invitation to consult with a group in Israel.

Dr. Fortier and his wife, the former Betty Weaver, are the parents of three children and six grandchildren. The Fortiers live in Chateau Estates and enjoy family activities at the Chateau Golf and Country Club.
