
The cost for this evening of food, friends and fun is the same as last year – \$35 per person.

Dr. Lou Grush to be honored at March 8 Installation Dinner

A dentist who might be called "Mr. Continuing Education" in these parts will be honored March 8 with the NODA Honor Dentist Award.

Dr. Louis G. Grush will receive the award at the annual NODA Installation Dinner at Chateau Estates Golf & Country Club for his contributions to dentistry, education and civic affairs

Dr. Grush recently retired after 25 years at the LSU School of Dentistry, including 10 as director of continuing education. At the same time he has served the New Orleans Dental Conference as its executive director, charged with signing up its clinicians and arranging the scientific program.

The affable and well-liked dentist returned recently from a post-retirement cruise to Barbados with a chest condition requiring major surgery. However, he is back on his feet and will be on hand to accept the award.

It was in 1971 that Dr. Grush joined LSUSD as a clinical instructor. He retired as an associate professor. He is known for his love of sports (as a student he once worked for the New Orleans Pelican baseball team). His big love, however, is the LSU Tigers (in any sport) and he has missed few games, often attending with his lifelong friends, Dr. Allen Copping, president of the LSU System, and fellow faculty member Dr. Anthony Carimi.

Dr. Grush spent most of his private practice years in Slidell where he was a member of a number of bank and business boards and civic groups. He has been general chairman of the New Orleans Dental Conference and served for two years as president of the Council on Dental Meetings, a national organization.

He is a graduate of Jesuit High and the Loyola University School of Dentistry. Recently he was presented the Pierre Fouchard award.

New PRO-MED insurance option offers lower out-of-pocket costs

January 1, 1997, marked the implementation of a new coverage option for the LDA-sponsored health insurance program. Developed under the leadership of NODA member and current LDA Council on Insurance Chairman, Dr. Mark Chaney, the new PRO-MED benefit plan is highlighted by such outstanding features as:

- \$2,000,000 lifetime maximum;
- \$25 co-pay for physician office visits;
- Maternity coverage as any other condition
 NO separate maternity deductible;
 - · Prescription Card;
- \$500 calendar year deductible (maximum two per family);
 - 80/20 co-insurance level;
- Co-insurance out-of-pocket maximum \$1000 per individual; \$2000 per family.

"The program is specifically designed to lower out-of-pocket expenses to program par-

ticipants," states Dr. Chaney. "In addition, the PRO-MED option offers some of the most competitive rates on the market. It is a positive reflection of the LDA Council's aim to provide its members with the best health insurance buy for their premium dollar."

Association members and their full-time employees also have the option to select either the 80/20 or 50/50 Full Indemnity program. These programs recently entered their third consecutive year with no overall rate increase. Whether an applicant elects the Full Indemnity or the PRO-MED plan option, the LDA-sponsored health insurance program remains one of the most valuable benefits of LDA membership.

Dr. Chaney further stated that the LDA has expanded program eligibility guidelines to allow coverage to members of the Mississippi Dental Association and the East Baton Rouge Parish Medical Society. "Although the LDA will continue to maintain control of the plan," says Chaney, "the increased participation afforded by these affinity groups adds to our ability to negotiate premium costs and benefits."

Other charges affecting the LDA plan on its January 1 renewal include the transfer of utilization review services from Ethix to Med-Com, Inc., and the approval of a new MSA (Medical Savings Account) program option.

Gilsbar, Inc. insurance consultants for the LDA, will be holding informational meetings and distributing materials on the new PRO-MED program. Those wishing immediate details may call Gilsbar at 1-800-445-7227, Ext. 744.
