Dr. Glaser, who assumes the presidency at the gala installation banquet Saturday, January 23 at the Key Largo Restaurant, says, "I want to continue the work Tony Miranda has begun, and hopefully explore some new avenues for advancing organized dentistry."

Dr. Glaser is a native New Orleanian who attended Warren Easton High School, moved to Tulane for his pre-dent and finally Loyola for his dental degree. Following graduation in 1963 he joined the U.S. Naval Dental Corps, spending a year at Norfolk, Va., and another year aboard a Navy transport ship.

After discharge, he opened his practice of general dentistry in Boutte, La. and has been there ever since. He has long been active in dental affairs, serving as NODA vice-
