NODA sponsoring area-wide Children's Dental Health Month


National Children's Dental Health Month is underway!



Dr. Frost: Dentistry and Sailing

Dr. Lawrence N. Frost III leads a busy life, keeping up with his two main activities: his dental practice and the international sport of competitive sailing.

Let's begin at the beginning. A native of New Orleans, he grew up in Baton Rouge where he attended Redemptorist High School, graduating in 1986.

Next came McNeese University in Lake Charles. He graduated in 1990 with his bachelor of science in biology education, followed by five years as a biology teacher in Baton Rouge high schools.

But thoughts of a career in either medicine or dentistry continued to linger in his mind. "A good friend interested me in dentistry and it was the best decision of my life," Dr. Frost recalls. He entered LSU School of Dentistry in June of 1995 and graduated with his DDS in 1999.

Looking back on his student days at LSUSD, Dr. Frost especially remembers "Dr. Allan Rappold, Dr. Camille Capdebosq, Dr. Shawky Mohammed and Dr. Ronnie Barrett." Says Dr. Frost of Dr. Barrett, "he took me under his wing and taught me how to be a dentist."


The young dentist associated with area dentists in the New Orelans area and in Bogalusa until June of 2000 when he purchased the practice of Dr. Barry Goodspeed who moved to Birmingham.

In his solo general dentistry practice at 135 N. Jefferson Davis Pkwy., Dr. Frost employs an assistant, a dental hygienist and an office manager.

When not in his office, the doctor can usually be found, often with his wife, the former Samantha Murphy, a certified public accountant in New Orleans, sailing his 19-foot Lightning Class sloop in competition in various parts of the country. He also sails various other classes of sailboats.

Dr. Frost won the Gulf Yachting Association, Gulf Coast championship this past year, along with the four-state Southern District championship. This was the third time he accomplished this feat.

He has competed in numerous national championships over the past five years, capturing his first national championship crewing for another sailor.

Fauchard body makes grants The Foundation of the Pierre Fauchard

The Foundation of the Pierre Fauchard Academy awarded more than \$387,000 in worldwide tuition scholarships and grants last year.

Dr. Robert Schira, PFA Foundation president, said 31 service program grants totaling over \$266,000 were awarded, predominantly for volunteer dental clinics that reach the underserved. 20% of the grants were distributed for services outside of the United States: Mexico (3), Costa Rica (2), France, Vietnam and Haiti.

81 scholarships of \$1,500 each, totaling \$121,000 were awarded to a dental student in each of 53 US dental schools and 28 dental schools in 20 other countries.

The 2001 awards brought the six-year total to more than \$1.8 million.

The third annual \$5,000 PFA Humanitarian Award was given to The New York Dental Association to help support dental practice victims of the September attack.

Included among the 31 program grants was the following award:

COMMUNICATIONS IN THE WORKPLACE

Six attitude bugs

Communication is more than just words, writes Robert Ash in the September *Journal of Dental Technology*. Communication is also attitude and actions, which go a long way toward creating the mood in the workplace.

Ash identifies six attitude bugs that destroy teamwork and harmony. Ash says these bugs are not choosy and can attack dentists, office managers, technicians and family members.

The Perfectionist Bug

When this bug bites someone, nothing will ever be good enough! Ash says it's as though they use a magnifying glass to check on others to make sure they are doing their jobs by their standards — not necessarily the office's standards. These persons fail to see that everyone is unique and see things differently.

The Resister Bug

This bug bites everyone at one time or another, Ash writes. When this bug bites, a person constantly resists and teamwork is destroyed. They resister rejects others' suggestions and resists everything.

It's Not-My-Job Bug

When bitten by this bug, people are unable to see beyond themselves. These people pass the buck to co-workers and fail to see that working as a team can be rewarding.

The Gossip Bug

This rumormonger bug can bite what appear to be friendly people. However, they seem to

know everything about everyone. They may not know all the facts, but the gossip they spread creates trouble between co-workers.

The Uncommitted Bug

Once bitten by the uncommitted bug, employees never again take their jobs seriously. "Who cares – it's just a job!" they spout.

The Pessimist Bug

When bitten by this bug, employees always find a reason why something new won't work. They shoot down ideas, fun, teamwork and anything else that gets in their negative path.

To exterminate these bugs, Ash says employees must take responsibility and exterminate the attitudes. He suggests:

- 1. acknowledging any negative attitude and taking responsibility for it;
- finding out why you might have a negative attitude;
- realizing the impact your attitude has on other employees;
- addressing the situation causing the stress:
- 5. replacing old negative reactions with a new positive response;
- 6. practicing the new response in a safe environment until it's comfortable before using it with your co-workers;
- 7. constantly being aware that you need to continue to use the positive response and not return to negative responses.

ADA Card Catalog is available on-line

The ADA library online catalog is now available on the Association's Web site at www.ada.org. ADA members can search the new electronic database the same way they would a card catalog – by author, title or subject – plus by key words or phrases. The catalog provides access to all book and journal titles acquired by the Library since 1980.

When members locate a title of interest, they can send a loan request directly to the Library by using the "Hold Request" function. Library staff will ship requested materials anywhere in the United States for \$10 per shipment (of up to five books each).

The library's Web page on ADA.org also contains online order forms for journal articles and reference packages, as well as links to information resources such as MEDLINE.

The ADA Library's collection contains approximately 5,000 volumes, making it one of the largest dental collections in the world. Books comprise approximately 30 percent of the collection; and over 10,000 book titles are listed in the online catalog.

When professional expertise is needed, members can call the Library, using the members-only toll-free line. Experienced dental librarians can provide assistance with short factual requests, complex subject inquiries or questions related to ADA.org, MEDLINE and other online dental information resources.
