



"Don't Let Your Smile Become Extinct!" is the theme for National Children's Dental Health Month February 1-28.


As it has for a half-century, NODA will join in the nationwide campaign designed to alert parents and children to the importance of lifetime dental care, beginning at an early age.

Dr. Jason Parker and Dr. Kevin Lacour are co-chairmen of the areawide NODA program beginning with the official opening day Monday, February 4 at Louisiana Children's Hospital.

Events during the rest of the month include a display and giveaways at Lakeside Mall, educational events for children at LSUSD, television spots on local stations and at Palace Theaters, a special "night" at a New Orleans Brass game, radio spots, presentations by NODA dentists at schools and other activities.

The campaign's theme refers to "Dudley the Dinosaur," the mascot who has highlighted Children's Dental Health Month graphics for several years. In the New Orleans area Dudley and his message will appear on thousands of milk cartons distributed by Barbe's Dairy to schools at lunchtime, as well as in stores.

National Children's Dental Health Month began as a one-day event in Cleveland, Ohio on February 3, 1941. The American Dental Asso-

ciation held the first national program in 1949. The event became a weeklong observance in 1955 and was extended to a month in 1981.

Dr. Brannon heads national body

Dr. Robert B. Brannon, associate professor, LSU Health Sciences Center School of Dentistry department of oral and maxillofacial pathology, was elected president of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology.

Dr. Brannon joined LSU after retiring from the US Air Force with the rank of colonel. He completed his training in oral pathology at Indiana University in 1973, where he received an M.S.D. degree. He established the first Air Force Oral Histopathology Center in Europe at Wiesbaden, Germany. Subsequent assignments included chairman, oral pathology department, Wilford Hall USAF Medical Center, Lackland AFB, Texas, and professor, Naval Dental School, Bethesda, Maryland.

His appointments include military consultant to the USAF Surgeon General for oral pathology from 1982 to 1996. He completed his military career as chairman, department of oral pathology at the Air Force Institute of Pathology, and registrar, Registry of Oral Pathology of the American Registry of Pathology.

As chair of the department of oral and maxillofacial pathology of the AFIP, Dr. Brannon was director of forensic dentistry activities, pro-

viding consultation to the Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner from 1993 to 1996.

Dental teamwork aids in tragedy

Dental teamwork and electronic dental identification triage were essential to the success of Operation Noble Eagle, "one of the most comprehensive forensic investigations in U.S. history," the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP) said in a series of reports. AFIP is an agency of the Department of Defense.

"All avenues of forensic investigation were explored and deployed with zero defects," said Navy Captain Glenn N. Wagner, AFIP director. Officials offered new details on AFIP's medicolegal response to the September 11 terrorist attacks, which is code named Operation Noble Eagle.

Officials credit a multidisciplinary effort in which dentists and dental forensics played important roles in the identification of victims of the terrorist attacks and said they hope to make it easier for dentists and other health professionals to "send digital information to us directly" in future disaster investigations.
